A questionnaire has been shared on both Facebook and Class DoJo which we would appreciate you completing with your child so that we can assess the levels of support each child will need as they return to full time schooling. Early next week we will be sending out details of entrance and exit times and procedures for dropping off and collecting your children. Children will be placed in class bubbles as opposed to year group bubbles. This will ensure less contact with other children and reduce the risk of the virus being spread should we be unfortunate and have a case of COVID in the school. Staff are working hard to make sure everything is in place to ensure a safe and secure return to school for your children. **Breakfast club at Wrockwardine Wood Infant School will reopen fully for Wrockwardine Wood Infant School and Nursery and Wrockwardine Wood C of E Junior School from 7.30am on Monday 8 March 2021**. Pre booking is essential and will be taken on a first come first serve basis. Due to new management and limited spaces, after school club will not be available through St Luke's Primary School. We are, as a school, exploring the possibility of setting up our own wrap around care but this will take some time to put in place.

We have recently invested in a new data handling piece of software called DC Pro. This will enable school leaders to analyse performance data focusing on both the attainment and progress of your children. The software accesses some sensitive information such as FSM status, SEN, LAC history, Pupil Premium and religion. This information is used to enable staff to explore trends and patterns in performance. This analysis will enable leaders and all teachers to ensure that your children receive tailored provision to help them achieve fully.



**Captain Tom Moore**


The Nations Hero comes in the shape of one man. He fought for his country but he had a plan. The world has been hit with a powerful virus.
