We now have 239 children in our school, 59 of who are on the SEND Register, making it 24% of our school. This is a growing number and we know this is also the picture nationally.

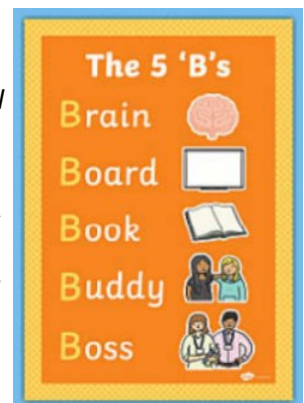
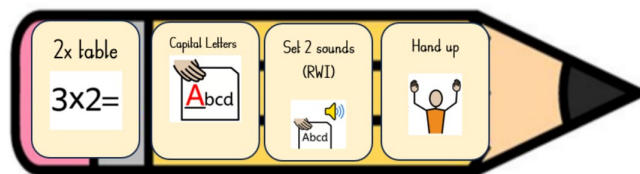

Pupil Voice

During the Spring and Summer Terms, our SEND Governor came into school to meet some of our children with SEND and look at their work. We followed them around school to get a view of the school day through their eyes and to see inclusion in practice. The children proudly showed off the work in their books and talked confidently about their independence. Ask your children about 'The 5 Bs' and how this helps them become independent learners. Children could also tell us how they know they are doing well. They weren't as confident in knowing what their targets are so we are introducing these child-friendly targets in September to help support children's understanding of their own learning journey:

TELFORD CHILDREN'S AUTISM HUB

Our Children's Autism Hub is available to children and young people aged 0-18, and their families, offering support for those with a formal diagnosis of Autism. We also now provide pre-diagnostic support for families who are on the Autism assessment pathway.

For individuals that have other needs, for example, a learning disability, the Autism Hub will provide support in respect of their Autism.

PODS

PODS have a range of activities on for both children and parents/carers. Head over to their website to see their calendar and sign up to their newsletter.

PODS also have a befriending scheme to support parents and carers during challenging times.

Befriending Scheme

PODS Befriending Scheme is a network of trained parent carer volunteers who offer emotional support to other parent carers of children or young people with a disability or additional need, at the time of diagnosis or during challenging times related to their child's disability.

Every Befriender has a child or young person with a disability or additional need themselves. They have the relevant lived experience and know what it is like to cope with a new diagnosis and the challenges that come with it in the future. The Befriending Scheme is a free, confidential service. We support parent carers of children with any type of disability or special need.
