Four children from year 6 read Flanders Fields to the children prior to our minutes silence to set the tone. The children were very effective and respectful throughout the day and we are

all proud of the maturity and interest they took in such an emotive topic.

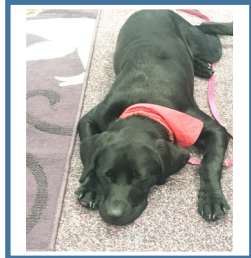
