### **Year 6 Crucial Crew**

The Crucial Crew initiative – led by Telford & Wrekin Council and funded by the Telford & Wrekin Community Safety Partnership – has equipped thousands of Year 6 pupils with essential life skills to help them stay safe and confident as they transition to secondary school and beyond. Held annually at Telford College, the event brings together thousands of youngsters for an immersive, hands-on experience. Children engage with real-life scenarios covering a wide range of safety topics from fire and road safety to modern-day challenges like knife crime, vaping, internet safety and mental health awareness.

Children take part in interactive workshops, including wearing "beer goggles" to simulate the effects of alcohol and learning how to respond in emergencies involving water, electricity, or fire. The event also tackles sensitive but critical

topics such as stranger danger, exploitation and mental wellbeing.


## **Attendance**

# We Love to Read!



Here at Wrockwardine Wood CE Junior, we are passionate about fostering and inspiring a love of reading for our pupils! We are changing the way we teach reading from September and are really excited to launch our revamped curriculum which will focus on fluency and comprehension of reading with a strong emphasis on vocabulary. As part of our new curriculum, we are going to be working on a different text each half term and studying sections of this text in depth. We will be setting the children small sections of this book to read over a weekend so they will be able to understand the work we carry out the following week and would really appreciate your support with reminding them to carry out their read (and reading with them if possible), looking after their school book at home and prompting them to return it to school on Mondays. This will also teach them valuable life skills about being responsible and organised!

We would also like to reward our pupils who read regularly at home. All pupils are set homework of reading at home at least 4 times per week and having their reading records signed by an adult. If pupils read at home 4 times per week (or more!) they will receive 4 reading dojo points for that week. When they have achieved 20 reading dojos, they will be allowed to come into school wearing their own clothes for



the day rather than school uniform as a treat! You will be informed via class dojo when this is the case. We would also like to thank you all for your support with reading – it makes such a difference to the children's progress and attitude and we really appreciate your hard work!




